Original fairytale ballet will enjoy world premiere in March 2016 in Rockville; tells how the Sugar Plum Fairy came to be.


Gaithersburg, MD, November 21, 2015 – Metropolitan Ballet Theatre (MBT) is announcing an original, full-length ballet to continue its 27th annual production season. *Becoming Sugar Plum* is a new fairytale conceived by MBT Artistic Director Elizabeth Odell Catlett, who will choreograph and stage the ballet. Composer Alexandra Bryant has been commissioned by MBT to create the original musical composition for this ballet. A children's storybook will be published with the same title, written by Ms. Catlett and local writer Heather Katz. The book is scheduled to be available at MBT's performances of *The Nutcracker* in December.

"This ballet project is two years in the making, and it's exciting to see it coming to the stage. We've created original ballets before at MBT, but never with an original storyline, new characters, and an original musical score," says Ms. Catlett. "While not at all related to a holiday season, this storyline is really a prequel to *The Nutcracker*. It details how the Sugar Plum Fairy came to rule the Kingdom of Sweets."

"Before she ruled the Kingdom of Sweets as the Sugar Plum Fairy, she was the sweet Princess Plum from Fairyland. One mystical dream, one dangerous journey, and one very courageous dance leads the Princess to her destiny as an admired, kind ruler.

You'll meet the beautiful fairies from Fairyland, the unpleasant King Dross and creatures from the Bitter Land, and the worried prince from the Land of Sweets. It is brave Princess Plum's fate to bring these lands together."

"Wholly new full-length ballets are rarely produced for a family audience, let alone in Montgomery County.
